


Musík Li Pim

Why learn about plants in Guatemala? Guatemala has 14 ecoregions ranging from Mangrove forests, to both ocean littorals with 5 different ecosystems. Guatemala has 252 listed wetlands, including 5 lakes, 61 lagoons, 100 rivers, and 4 swamps. Tikal National Park, was the first mixed UNESCO World Heritage Site. Guatemala is a country of distinct fauna. It has some 1246 known species. Of these, 6.7% are endemic and 8.1% are threatened. Guatemala is home to at least 8681 species of vascular plants, of which 13.5% are endemic.







Musík Li Pim Certificate Program

This 10 day intensive study program is dedicated to bring about the understanding, preservation and knowledge of plant medicine through hands-on experience. This program will also offer a personal experience to understand the Mayan energies and connect with the plant's spirit.

All classes, tour, and herb walk will be given by the elders from the Maya Nation, Guatemala.

Certificate

Students who complete the course work to a satisfactory standard will be provided a certificate at the end of the program.

- Stay in a dorm at Coban, where the school is located
- Each morning will begin each morning with a healthy breakfast
- Learn about your personal energies
- Learn about Mayan numbers
- Study up to 20 plants and how to use them as medicine
- Experience a Mayan fire ceremony
- Herb walk
